

General Objectives of the Scientific Program

To address the demands of such a dynamic and diverse field, the IFSSH Congress 2031 has outlined clear objectives for its scientific program, covering traditional surgeries and the most recent transformative advances:

• Focus on Commonly Performed Traditional Surgeries:

Procedures like tendon repairs, osteosynthesis, and treatment of compressive syndromes, which form the foundation of surgical practice, will receive special attention.

• Capacity Building and Practical Training:

Satellite and pre-congress courses focusing on arthroscopy, microsurgery, and advanced techniques will allow participants to develop practical skills.

• Exploring Minimally Invasive Surgeries:

Practical sessions on arthroscopic and robotic techniques will ensure surgeons are prepared for these innovative and less invasive approaches.

Challenges in Complex Reconstructions:

Techniques such as nerve and muscle transfers, composite tissue allotransplantation, and advances in regenerative medicine will be central to the discussions.



• Peripheral Nerve Surgeries:

Innovative diagnostic and therapeutic approaches for compressive neuropathies and traumatic injuries will be highlighted.

• Promoting Evidence-Based Medicine:

Sessions dedicated to presenting scientific research to support clinical and technological practices.

• Experience Sharing and Global Inclusion:

Exchange of Experiences Between Countries: Sessions focused on sharing strategies, challenges, and solutions adapted to the economic and cultural conditions of different regions.

Reducing Inequalities: Discussions on adapting medical innovations for countries with limited resources, promoting greater equity in healthcare access.

International Collaboration: Support from LAWA and IWAS leaders. Focus: Wrist arthroscopy techniques and advanced hand surgery.

• Symposia with IFSSH Committees:

Congenital Deformities: Pre-congress course or symposium focusing on the OMT classification system.

Pediatric Hand Group (PULM Talks): Course led by international experts.

Flap Course (Upper and Lower Limbs):

Practical course in anatomy labs, emphasizing periosteal and reconstructive flap techniques.

Virtual and Hybrid Options:

Live streaming of practical and theoretical components for a global audience, integrating professionals from low- and middle-income countries.







Brazil Visa Exempt Countries

Citizens from over 60 countries are not required to obtain a visa in order to enter Brazil. Holders of a valid passport traveling for tourism, business, artistic or sports activities are granted a stay of up to 90 days, not exceeding 180 days within a 12-month period, counted from the date of the first entry.

Brazil launches an electronic visa platform for citizens of USA, Australia and Canada

Travelers must provide a valid visa starting from April 10, 2025

Effective 10 April 2025, nationals of Australia, Canada, and the United States require an Electronic visitor visa to enter Brazil. A platform through which travelers can obtain the Electronic Visa (eVisa) to enter the country has been launched. Travelers can submit their applications and supporting documents online. Once the application is approved, travelers receive their eVisa confirmation electronically.

The eVisa will allow multiple entries and will have the same validity as conventional visas for the following nationalities:

Canadians: 5-year period;
Australians: 5-year period;
Americans: 10-year period.

Americans, Canadians, and Australians must apply for the document if their arrival in Brazil is scheduled for April 10, 2025 onwards. The system was developed by the Brazilian Ministry of ForeignAffairs withtheintentionofsimplifyingtheprocess, making it convenient, fast and easy.



Agreement with Japan

Brazil and Japan have reached a bilateral agreement and, since September 30, 2023 visa requirements have been waived for trips between Brazil and Japan for up to 90 days. In this case, the waiver is reciprocal: it applies to Brazilian visitors heading to Japan and to Japanese visitors heading to Brazil.

Reciprocity

The reintroduction of the visa requirement was based on the principle of reciprocity, reinstated in May of 2023.



Security

Rio Operations Center (COR)

The Rio Operations Center (COR) was the first Olympic equipment delivered by Rio's City Hall. Inaugurated in December 2010, six years before the Rio 2016 Games, the building serves as the headquarters for the integration of urban operations in the municipality. About 30 agencies (municipal secretariats and utilities) are integrated into the building to monitor the city's operation and minimize its impacts on citizen routine or during major events. 24 hours a day, seven days a week, the COR seeks to anticipate solutions by alerting responsible sectors of the risks and urgent measures that should be taken in emergencies such as heavy rainfall, landslides and traffic accidents. More than 500 professionals take turns in different shifts in this city monitoring.



BPTur - Tourist Police Battalion


It's a special operational unit of the State of Rio de Janeiro Military Police, being the only battalion dedicated to the ostensible policing in areas of great tourist flow in the state capital. Also available to support congress and events that attract large numbers of tourists, reinforcing the policing on the region where the event takes place. In addition, amongst the government initiatives to grant security are the projects "Rio Presente" and "Rio + Seguro" which operates in areas of large tourist concentration reinforcing security with policeman and municipal guards that are retired or on day off duty.

The implementation of these two projects have been reducing considerably the number of incidents, mainly in the Downtown and South Zone areas. Also, the operation of BPTur and the increase of police force in the streets have impacted positively in the quality of life of residents and tourists. Besides all the above measures, it is usual to have security reinforcement in areas where big events are taking place. BPTur, in addition to being the battalion responsible for consular activities in Rio de Janeiro, works very closely with other specialized commands, such as expressways, highways and crowd control. All this connection between battalions of different specialties, guarantee the necessary security for events in the city.

Through the partnership established between the Rio Convention and Visitors Bureau and BPTur, it is possible to provide police reinforcement for events by analyzing each demand.

These measures will further enhance security and wellbeing of all visitors in Rio de Janeiro. It is of utmost priority to the city to provide a trouble-free and most pleasant experience to all our visitors.











Christ the Redeemer

From the top of Corcovado Hill, amidst a stunning urban forest, the imposing statue of Christ the Redeemer reigns supreme. It's no wonder that Christ, the largest Art Deco sculpture in the world, is listed among the New Seven Wonders of the World. As the city's iconic symbol, it stands with open arms, welcoming visitors to Rio de Janeiro.

To reach the statue, which stands 38 meters tall at an altitude of 710 meters, you have two options: a delightful train ride that winds through the Atlantic Forest from the Cosme Velho neighborhood, or a trip via authorized vans that travel along the Paineiras Road. Regardless of your choice, the view is breathtaking.

Sugar Loaf

The cable car ride connecting the Urca and Sugarloaf Mountains is a must-do in the city. From here, you'll be treated to a stunning view that includes Botafogo Bay, Copacabana Beach, and the entrance to Guanabara Bay. At 395 meters above sea level, Sugarloaf Mountain offers additional perspectives of the city, including Pedra da Gávea, downtown Rio, Copacabana Beach, and the Christ the Redeemer statue.

To enhance your visit, there are dining and entertainment options available, panoramic helicopter tours, and a large amphitheater on Urca Hill that hosts concerts and events, all set against the breathtaking cityscape.

Maracanã Stadium

Maracanã Stadium has hosted some of the most important matches in Brazilian football history and has seen many significant international moments. As the venue for the 1950 and 2014 World Cup finals, it is open for tours every day. The Football Museum, located on the ground floor of the stadium, features treasures that will delight football enthusiasts. Inside, you'll find a collection of jerseys, cleats, and a walk of fame. There are many surprises awaiting you!

Lapa Arches and Santa Teresa district

Located in the Largo da Lapa Square, the center of Rio's turn-of-the-century nightlife, the Lapa Arches hold their place in history as the most monumental work undertaken in colonial Rio. This magnifi cent structure contains 42 arches in two tiers. Originally built as an aqueduct to supply the city with water, today they carry another outstanding attraction: the scenic tramlines linking the Carioca Station downtown to the pictures- que Santa Teresa district, a vibrant artistic community, with a great range of bars, restaurants, museums, cultural centers and artist's studios.



Rio's BioPark

Located in Quinta da Boa Vista, an area formerly owned by the imperial family, the former Rio de Janeiro zoo is now known as BioParque do Rio. It has undergone a major renovation, transforming from a traditional exhibit-based zoo into a modern Biodiversity Conservation Center. With key programs focused on education and research, the revamped BioParque ensures animal welfare while combining environmental education with visitor comfort.

Tijuca National Park

Rio's largest park is the Tijuca National Park, covering 3,300 hectares, and including Tijuca Forest. The Park is the largest urban forest in the world. As you look up at the Corcovado from the Lagoa, the mass of greenery clinging to the edge of the mountain and stretching miles to your left, is the Tijuca National Park. Roads run through the entire length of the park allowing visitors to enjoy its many natural wonders, and at the weekend some of the routes become pedestrian only. The most well-known part of the park is the Tijuca Forest which is reached from Alto da Boa Vista, accessible from all parts of the city.

Botanical Garden

Created in 1808 by D. João VI of Portugal, the Rio de Janeiro Botanical Garden is famous for the exuberance and the scientific importance of its plant collection, as well as for the beauty of its landscapes. Its bicentennial history is expressed in its monuments, buildings and artworks. The visitors can walk along the alleys or rent an electric car to see plants from all over the world, visit the greenhouses (Orchids, Bromeliads, Ferns, Insectivorous Plants) and the thematic collections and gardens, like the Japanese Garden, created in 1935 from the donation of 65 species of tipical Japanese plants.

Lage Park

Originally a sugar mill, the park is a significant part of the city's historical heritage. Notable features include imperial palm trees, artificial lakes and islands, and caves with aquariums embedded in their walls that house various fish species. In the central courtyard of the mansion, near the pool, there is a bistro where you can enjoy meals while attending the art and music events held at the venue throughout the year.

Pedra Branca State Park

Located in the West Zone of the city, this park is one of the largest urban natural parks in the world. Established in 1974, it is covered with typical Atlantic Forest vegetation and spans an area four times larger than Tijuca National Park (equivalent to 12,500 Maracanã stadiums). It is home to the highest point in the city, Pico da Pedra Branca, which stands at 1,024 meters. The park serves the residents of Rio de Janeiro by supplying important reservoirs: Pau da Fome, Camorim, Taxas, and Engenho Novo. Additionally, Pedra Branca offers a variety of trails and ecological tours.



Catacumba Park

Situated by Lagoa Rodrigo de Freitas in an area reforested in the 1970s, the park boasts a diverse range of plant life. In the lower section, paved paths, small stone-paved plazas, and sculpture displays create an ideal setting for walks and picnics. In contrast, the upper section features denser forested areas where a 600-meter trail leads to a beautiful viewpoint. The park also offers various activities such as tree climbing, rappelling, zip-lining, and a climbing wall.



Museum of Tomorrow


Museum of Tomorrow is an Applied Sciences museum which explores the opportunities and challenges which humanity will be forced to tackle in the coming decades from the perspective of sustainability and conviviality. It was conceived to be the first of a new generation of science museums around the world exploring possibilities by using audiovisuals, interactive installations and games. The museum's building was designed by Spanish architect Santiago Calatrava, whose style brings together technique, functionality and beauty based on the observation of nature.

MAR - Rio's Museum of Art

MAR is located in Praça Mauá, in two buildings with both heterogeneous and interconnected profi les: the Dom João VI Mansion, listed and eclectic, which houses the exhibition rooms, and the neighbouring building, in a modernist style – originally a bus station – where the Escola do Olhar is situated. Its exhibitions unite historical and contemporary dimensions of art through national and international exhibitions of long and short duration.





AquaRio

With 26,000 m² of built area and 4.5 million liters of water, AquaRio is the largest marine aquarium in South America with 8,000 animals from 350 diff erent species on display. Lots of unprecedented attractions, grandiose enclosures and tanks and all the necessary infrastructure provide educational and entertainment to the public. In addition, there are another 24 secondary tanks and specifi c areas where the public, especially children, can interact with some of the exposed animals.

Yup Star Rio

With 88 meters high, 54 air-conditioned gondolas with capacity for up to eight people and accessible for people with disabilities, the Ferris wheel is definitely part of the city's postcards. Located in Porto Maravilha on Orla Conde – very close to AquaRio – Rio Star takes around 20 minutes to go around and can provide a beautiful view of the wonderful city for up to 432 people at the same time.

Mural Etnias

As you stroll through Boulevard Olímpico, you'll have the opportunity to marvel at the "Mural Etnias" by Brazilian artist Eduardo Kobra. This is the largest graffiti mural in the world, standing 15 meters high and stretching 170 meters long. Created to celebrate the gathering of people from around the globe during the 2016 Olympic Games, the mural features images of representatives from all five continents.



Flamengo Park

Known as one of the city's largest recreational areas, this vast green space connects downtown to the South Zone, beginning at Santos Dumont Airport, passing through the neighborhoods of Flamengo and Glória, and extending to the edge of Botafogo. Designed by landscape architect Roberto Burle Marx, the park features a diverse range of flora, including both native and exotic species, as well as an extensive bike path. It is a popular spot on weekends for sports activities.



Barra da Tijuca and surroundings

Located in the West Zone of Rio, this area boasts major international hotel chains, modern shopping centers, state-of-the-art cinemas, and acclaimed restaurants, among other attractions. Culture is also a highlight, with the Cidade das Artes, the largest cultural space in Rio, situated here. Nearby, the Pontal Museum is considered the largest and most significant folk art museum in the country. Its collection, the result of 45 years of research and travels throughout Brazil by French designer Jacques Van de Beuque, is composed of approximately 9,000 pieces from 300 Brazilian artists, produced from the 20th century onwards. Additionally, the extensive Barra da Tijuca beach is another significant feature of the area.



Beaches

Rio de Janeiro's coastline is renowned for its diverse beaches, each with unique characteristics. Leme, an extension of Copacabana, features calm waters ideal for swimming. Copacabana itself, famous for its mosaic sidewalks, is bustling with bars, kiosks, hotels, and restaurants, and invites leisurely strolls along its shore. Moving along the coast, Arpoador, Ipanema, and Leblon beaches stretch for another 4,000 meters. These spots are popular for surfing, enjoying sunsets, and are famously featured in the song "Girl from Ipanema."

São Conrado beach is known for hang gliding, while further west, Barra da Tijuca offers 18 kilometers of golden sand, making it Rio's longest beach. Next, Recreio is noted for its rough seas, followed by a series of beautiful beaches including Prainha, Grumari, Barra de Guaratiba, Pedra de Guaratiba, and Sepetiba. Pedra de Guaratiba, with its charming fishing village, provides fresh seafood to numerous local restaurants.



Barra da Tijuca

Barra da Tijuca is a popular area in Rio de Janeiro known for its beautiful beaches and natural landscapes.

It is located in the western zone of the city and offers a variety of entertainment, leisure, and cultural options for tourists. The area is also characterized by its extensive stretches of white sand and crystal-clear beaches.




SIGHTSEEING & EXCURSION **SURROUNDINGS**



NITERÓI (Metropolitan Region)

It is a city known for its beautiful beaches and for being home to the MAC - Museum of Contemporary Art of Niterói. Designed by renowned architect Oscar Niemeyer, the museum is a work of art in itself, with its flying saucer-shaped architecture and a privileged view of Guanabara Bay. The museum's collection includes works by important Brazilian and international artists that attract visitors from all over the world.



PETRÓPOLIS (Imperial Green Mountains)

Also known as the "Imperial City", it is located 68 kilometers northeast of the city of Rio de Janeiro. The name of the city ("Pedro's city") honors Pedro II, the last emperor of Brazil, who is buried in the Cathedral of São Pedro de Alcântara.



VALE DO CAFÉ (Coffee Valley)

The nobility of its farms and large colonial houses complement the landscape with a welcoming atmosphere and pleasant climate. The region offers visitors an excellent climate and a historical journey through Rio de Janeiro through its rural architecture - large colonial houses, farms and slave houses - a rich cultural heritage that is worth visiting and exploring.

12. Experience

The History of the SBCM

In a wartime scenario, specifically World War II, from the push given to the evolution of the techniques and medical knowledge that gave rise to the specialist area of Hand Surgery. In Brazil, being enormously influenced by their British and French colleagues, a few general and plastic surgeons performed surgery on hands, and these individuals became pioneers in the specialist area. In the period immediately following World War II, the country received visits from well-known specialists such as Guy Pulvertaft, Watson Jones, Trueta and Sterling Bunnell. These visits provided the incentive for the creation of our society.

In Rio de Janeiro on June 17, 1959, 57 doctors signed the Minutes of the Foundation of the Brazilian Society of Hand Surgery. After a number of conferences and courses, the SBCM's first large-scale event was the First International Congress, held in Rio de Janeiro between 19th and 21st July, 1965. Bulcão chaired the Congress, which welcomed around 400 participants, with simultaneous translation provided for a number of different languages, whilst it also boasted the participation of recognized names from the field of Hand Surgery at the time, such as: Erik Moberg, Joseph Boyes, Starck, O'brien, Kauko Vainio, the Argentines Firpo and Loda, as well as our own Brazilian pioneers.

The IFSSH - the International Federation of Societies for Surgery of the Hand - was founded in 1966. The SBCM performed an active role in its foundation, being one of the eight founding societies alongside those from the United States, the United Kingdom, France, Italy, Germany, Scandinavia and Japan.

Dates and some of the many notable events that have built the history of the Brazilian Society for Surgery of the Hand.

In 1945, Orlando Graner created in Santa Casa de São Paulo the first Hand Surgery service in Latin America.

In 1965, Ronaldo Azze and Marcus Castro Ferreira start performing the first reimplants of limbs at the FMUSP Hospital das Clínicas, creating South America's first Microsurgery Service in 1974.

In 1985, Arlindo Pardini publishes the first edition of the multi-authored book on the specialist area of "hand traumas" in Brazil, which has since seen two further editions.

In 1992, the SBCM takes part in the founding of the South American Hand Surgery Society, in São Paulo.

In 2004, Arlindo Pardini assumes the presidency of the IFSSH, a position never before held by a professional from Latin America.

The SBCM has sixty five years of history and, since its beginnings, it has been committed to staging national and international events and courses, as well as contributing to meetings with important international scientific knowledge, and in the form of publications in periodicals and books focusing on hand surgery. The Society publishes an informative quarterly periodical, the 'Manus'.

The "shrinking world": International ease of travel, Instant global communication, shared common goals, intellectual pursuit of scientific information, cultural differences and the beauty of sharing them. These modern day wonders have not always existed in the field of Hand and Upper Extremity Surgery. But, because of the efforts of some International pioneers, luminaries and visionaries in our beloved surgical specialty, the world of Hand Surgery has built many conduits and bridges between colleagues around the globe for the purpose of sharing knowledge, surgical techniques and research for the betterment of all people in all lands. From the time of birth, the Hand becomes the developing child's antenna, exploring its unfolding world as a tool of experimentation. In time it becomes an instrument of communication, industry, art, music, love, and yes, even surgical reconstruction. The recognition of the great importance of the Hand only became clear surgically during the second World War, when surgeons emerging into a new world of modern medicine realized how little they knew about the Hand and how limited they were in reconstructing it when injured. Had they studied its anatomy and function as carefully as had Michelangelo centuries earlier, they would probably not have found themselves in the situation they did. But a few surgeons, internationally who recognized the importance of the Hand in every aspect of human life began to study, share ideas, and develop a surgical subspecialty dedicated to the care of this incredibly precise, articulated, artistic and beautifully complicated organ. This remarkable awakening did not happen in a single location, nor in a single country. As such, a few surgeons in Europe, the U.S., Asia, Australia and South America recognized the need to very expeditiously develop a surgical specialty dedicated to the Hand, and its reconstruction. In Brazil, a number of pioneering surgeons began to embrace Hand Surgery as a specialty. In 1945, (the year before the inaugural meeting of the American Society for Surgery of the Hand), Professor Domingos Delfine started the 1st Hand Surgery Service in São Paulo. Professor Godoy Morreira Chief of Orthopaedics at Faculdade de Medicina, University of São Paulo, opened the second dedicated Hand Surgery Center directed by Lauro Barros de Abreu until 1979. From 1945 on, many Brazilian Surgeons traveled the world to bring back new technology, information and techniques to expand the ever-increasing practice of "cutting edge" Hand Surgery. In 1965 the first replantation was performed in São Paulo, and by 1974 Ronaldo Azze and Marcus Castro Ferreira developed the first Microsurgery Center in all of South America. This explosion in the interest in and dedication to the specialty of Hand Surgery spread across all of Brazil with centers opening in many metropolitan areas. In Rio De Janeiro, Danilo Gonçalves, Director of Orthopaedics, Hospital Souza Aguiar, developed a Center

for Emergency Care of the traumatized hand, as well as a center for care of the Rheumatoid Hand. He was instrumental in the June 17, 1959 organization of Brazilian Society for Surgery of the Hand at the inaugural meeting in Rio De Janeiro. He also collaborated with José Raul Chiconelli to develop the first Hand surgery training program, also in Rio. At the Inaugural meeting of Brazilian Society for Surgery of the Hand there were 44 Orthopaedic and Plastic Surgery founding Members. In 1965, under the leadership of Henrique Bulcão de Moraes, Brazil hosted the first International Meeting of Hand Surgery with attendees from every continent, which stimulated many more young surgeons to pursue a career in this blossoming field. The following year Brazil was recognized as a world leader in Hand Surgery and was asked to be one of the Founding Nations of the International Federation of Societies for Surgery of the Hand (I.F.S.S.H.) at its inaugural meeting in Chicago, represented by Dr. Alipio Pernet. The past 60 years have witnessed the evolution of the Brazilian Sociely for Surgery of the Hand into a recognized world leader in the expansion of Hand Surgery throughout the entire Upper Limb. It now has five regional societies and remains a cornerstone member of IFSSH. I am a better surgeon today because of all I have learned from many Brazilian Colleagues who have willingly shared their knowledge with me on every trip I have made to Brazil. I was also delighted to help host The members of Brazilian Sociely for Surgery of the Hand as the ASSH Guest Nation at our Annual Meeting at which I was inducted as the 69th ASSH President, in 2014. I am delighted that currently 56 of my Brazilian colleagues are International Members of ASSH! I am especially grateful to the autors Samuel Ribak and Osvandré Lech for the honor and privilege of congratulating and saluting all of my Brazilian Colleagues and members of Brazilian Sociely for Surgery of the Hand through this humble remembrance on this auspicious occasion of their 60th Anniversary. To conclude, I would like to thank the Brazilian Society of Hand Surgery for everything you shared with me, taught me and, above all, the kindness shown to me during all these years! I hope our academic collaboration will continue for many years and that we work together to build bridges and provide better and better care for our patients everywhere. With deepest admiration and gratitude for our friendship and fellowship, Bill Seitz.



Humanitarian Missions

Summary of Social Actions by SBCM (2015 - 2025)

The Brazilian Society for Surgery of the Hand (SBCM) has been actively involved in organizing humanitarian missions. for children and adults with hand and limb deformities across Brazil. These actions aim to provide quality healthcare and improve the quality of life for patients by addressing complex medical needs that are often unmet due to resource constraints.

2025: A surgery marathon in Belém do Pará, located in the heart of the Amazon rainforest, will focus on children with congenital deformities, as part of the 45th Brazilian Congress of Hand Surgery. Up to 30 surgeries are planned.

2024: In partnership with SBOP, a specialized surgical team led by Dr. Francisco Soldado conducted surgeries focused on correcting tibial pseudarthrosis in São Paulo, using innovative techniques such as the periosteal vascularized free flap to avoid amputations.

2023: The "Uma Mãozinha" initiative in Macapá attended to 16 children, providing necessary surgeries for congenital upper limb issues. Macapá, located in the northern Amazon region, faces socioeconomic challenges and geographic isolation.





2022: A series of surgical marathons in Natal and Pará focused on correcting sequelae and deformities, with significant patient and professional engagement.

2021: Nationally coordinated surgery marathons were held in multiple regions, targeting pediatric hand deformities, and emphasizing the need for early interventions.

2019 & 2016: Efforts in Alagoas and Pará included surgeries for brachial plexus injuries and preventive health marathons, respectively, highlighting the importance of specialized care.

In September **2015**, the SBCM's Mãos em Ação project in Alagoas provided free diagnosis and treatment for hand injuries, raising awareness about accident prevention. The initiative included diagnostics, consultations, and surgeries to improve public healthcare services.

The ongoing commitment of SBCM through these initiatives has not only addressed critical health issues but also fostered professional development and awareness, enhancing the overall healthcare landscape in Brazil.







13. Co-operation with the IFSHT

Founded in 1988, the Brazilian Society of Hand Therapy (SBTM) was established with the mission of uniting occupational therapists and physical therapists who specialize in the rehabilitation of the hand and upper limb. This initiative was marked by a pioneering collaboration between therapists and hand surgeons, underscoring the critical importance of interdisciplinary approaches to the functional recovery of patients.

SBTM also takes pride in its collaborations with esteemed international therapists such as Evelyn Mackin, Elaine Fess, Roslyn B. Evans, Judy C. Colditz, and Judith Bell. These partnerships have been instrumental in adapting global best practices to the Brazilian context.

With over three decades of history, the SBTM remains steadfast in its mission to promote excellence in hand and upper limb rehabilitation, emphasizing scientific practice and the exchange of knowledge. This enduring legacy reflects the society's commitment to transforming lives through technical and human advancements.
